GEMT Update

The Center for Medicaid Service (CMS) have received our State Plan Amendment (SPA) and those cost reports submitted to our IFCA contact source. The State has received a response from CMS that asks for clarifications on the type of agencies that are making application and the taxing bodies they are affiliated with and how they collect fees for service and other revenues. This is actually good news in that they are responding to our SPA and we will do what is necessary to answer any questions that come about.

There may be a possibility that certain funds may begin to be distributed soon based on the nature of service requesting to be reimbursed. We will continue to have meetings and discussions with the State Department of Health and Human Services and the Medicaid Specialist designated by that agency to be as helpful as we can to aid in facilitating this very important initiative for all the Medicaid transport providers throughout the State.

Chief Fire Officer

The program is still accepting applications for the 2020 Program which begins in January. The deadline for applications is December 15, 2019.

PROGRAM FACTS

This program meets all the certification requirements for Illinois OSFM Chief Fire Officer level and Fire Officer III and IV level. The program is designed and intended for command level officers and/or administrators who have the responsibilities of supervising and administrating a Fire Department or Fire District. Officers preparing for a chief level position are encouraged to apply.

The majority of the program is on-line with only one classroom session for each class. The program is divided into 12 modules containing one class each and three independent study projects that require a written research paper. If you are outside the Chicago metro area, please contact us for possible alternative delivery methods. We are hoping to have enough students to fill two classes again this year. Please note the location and delivery day changes.

ON-LINE COURSEWORK

The students are required to complete the on-line course work during the month assigned. Students residing and working outside of the 150-mile radius of the delivery location can attend an on-line classroom session on one of the days assigned.

COURSE FEE

For those candidates enrolled in the Chief Fire Officer program the tuition is \$3,550.00. This fee includes all educational materials, lunch and administrative expenses. A limited number of 50% scholarships are available.

LOCATION:

This year we will be having the first class each month at the Cook County Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, Emergency Operations Center in Oak Forest, IL. The second class each month will be held at the MABAS Readiness Center in Wheeling.

National Firefighter Registry Website Now Active

The National Firefighter Registry website is now active. Please take time to click the below to learn about it and how every firefighter - should be made aware of and participate in this important project.

To better understand the link between on-the-job exposure to toxicants and cancer, Congress directed the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to create the National Firefighter Registry (NFR). The NFR will be used to track and analyze cancer trends and risk factors among the U.S. fire service to help the public safety community, researchers, scientists and medical professionals find better ways to protect those who protect our communities and environment.

ALL FIREFIGHTERS.

All Firefighters structural and wildland, career and volunteer, active and retired should participate in the NFR. This includes Firefighters who have never received a cancer diagnosis, previously had cancer, or currently have cancer.

Participation in the NFR is voluntary **HOWEVER** by providing vital information about their own health and work experiences, Firefighters who register for the NFR will play a critical role in helping to better understand the health risks our profession faces.
