We can all agree that there is a great need for training senior officers who act in, or aspire to, the chief officer rank in their organization. As a senior officer in your department you are faced with many responsibilities not covered specifically in company officer training. This two-day mini-symposium has been put together for officers to help you better understand the duties and liabilities. This program is primarily for senior officers who may be new at the chief officer rank or who act to support that administrative function. However, it is also aimed at those individuals regardless of rank, who aspire to be a Chief Officer someday.

This program is designed as an interactive program with its success directly related to your participation. At the end of each section the students are asked not only offer their feedback on the instructors but also the relevancy of the material which then drives curriculum revisions.

- ◇ Student will be challenged to look at the fire service, what do you want to get out of it?
- ◇ Students will be challenged to consider Why did you get into it?
- ◇ Students will get the perspective and the evaluation of self-realization that we're not going to get rich being in the fire service, what are you hear and how do you get others to realize why they are here.

May-Day for Mental Health: Chief Patrick Kenny

- ◇ Identify the 13th Life Safety Initiative and discuss the relevancy to today's Fire Service.
- ◇ Identify the obstacles to mental health awareness in the Fire Service/the stigma attached.
- ◇ Identify some basic mental health conditions and their signs and symptoms.

- ◇ Examine current NFPA and other major Fire Service organizations and their approach to mental health.
- ◇ Identify strengths and weaknesses in their current employee assistance programs and offer suggestions to address these areas
