An invitation to the 2018 VCOC Conference

On behalf of the IFCA Executive Board, and the Volunteer and Combination Officer Committee members, I extend an invitation to volunteer and combination fire chiefs and officers from around Illinois to join the VCOC in our annual Conference. This year's dates are September 8 & 9, 2018 at the Marriott Hotel & Conference Center in Bloomington/Normal.

The IFCA-VCOC hosts the only conference in the Midwest tailored for the education of volunteer and combination fire officers. There are many great conferences out there; however, very few focus on the specific topics important to the officer who is leading the very dynamic structure of a volunteer and combination department. Our VCOC Conference Committee has carefully designed educational tracks with topics that are important and interesting to the officer of a volunteer and combination department.

When you arrive at the hotel on Friday night, explore many of the great restaurants of Bloomington/Normal. On Saturday morning join us for a light breakfast and because we are firefighters, plenty of coffee. The conference kicks off at 8:30 am on Saturday morning.

We are excited to be joined this year by Chief Peter Lamb who will deliver our keynote presentation on Saturday morning. Pete will present "**A Common Sense Approach to Successful Leadership**". This interactive program offers common sense solutions and a realistic experience based approach for small to medium sized departments. Chief Lamb's 40+ years' experience as a firefighter, officer and Fire Chief make this a presentation not to miss. Pete will be with us again on Saturday afternoon for his fast paced presentation "**Door to Door Firefighting**" which examines the fire ground from initial response through fire attack and will make you think about both your past and future fire responses.

As a regular feature of our conference, we will present the "**Small Town - Big Incident**" series Saturday afternoon. This year we will be joined by Deputy Chief Jim Connolly of the Westmont Fire Department to discuss lessons learned from a hazardous materials incident that resulted in several fires and explosions over a two day period and involved over 100 responding agencies.

On Sunday morning we will start with a hearty breakfast at the hotel. Our first presentation on Sunday is Chief Joe Knitter who will present his popular class "**Fast Food Restaurant Fires**" which has been featured at both national and regional conferences. Every community, regardless of size, has at least one fast food establishment and Chief Knitter's presentation is packed with information that will be valuable to your department.

Chief Scott Pahlmann of the Chapin, Illinois Fire Department will offer his experience, lessons learned and advice during his presentation on "**The New Volunteer Fire Chief**". Deputy Chief Rudy Horist, representing the Firefighter Cancer Support Network will then close out our day with an important presentation on "**Firefighter Cancer Awareness**".

I believe you will find this conference provides you with solid information on how to successfully lead your organization, plan for the future, and protect the safety of your firefighters and your community.

Speedway Gasoline Leak

Deputy Chief Jim Connolly, Westmont FD

In October, 2017 there was a release of up to 10,000 gallons of gasoline into the ground at a Westmont (IL) gasoline station. The product eventually migrated into the sanitary sewer line and resulted in several fires and explosions over two days. This presentation will discuss the incident management challenges with approximately 100 Federal, State and Local agencies responding to this incident and the importance of preplanning for when the "big one" occurs.

"Fast Food Restaurant Fires"

Chief Joe Knitter, South Milwaukee FD

Inspired by the tragic loss of two firefighters in an intentionally set fire at a McDonald's Restaurant in Houston, Texas, on Valentine's Day, 2000, this class takes the audience "behind the counter" and "above the ceiling tiles" for a first-hand look at the building construction and design characteristics and the associated hazards that pose a deadly threat to fire suppression personnel. The focus is on raising the awareness of company officers and firefighters of the dangers of this common form of free-standing construction found in nearly every response area. Topics covered include the causes of fires in these structures, common construction features and engineered lumber products, and operational considerations and tactical tidbits for fighting fires in these occupancies.

Chief Peter Lamb is a 40 year veteran of the fire service and is the Chief of the Johnston RI Fire Department. In addition he has led three suburban fire departments and served in multiple capacities at the Massachusetts Firefighting Academy and served as the director of state training. Chief Lamb has been an instructor for over 25 years and taught thousands of firefighters. Chief Lamb has lectured for 18 years for Firehouse Expo and World Programs. Chief Lamb is the Host of the weekly YouTube show called Firefighting Today, and also the host of The Firefighter Training Podcast. Chief Lamb has authored articles for periodicals and has lectured nationally on a variety of topics including, using technology in the fire service, tactics, incident command, training, and operations.



Deputy Chief Jim Connolly Jim has been a member of the Westmont Fire Department for 37 years with more than 25 years as a Chief Officer. He is currently the Deputy Chief of Operations. He is also the Communications and Logistics Committee Chair for MABAS Division 10 and a member of the Division 10 Incident Management Assistance Team (IMAT).

Jim is a Fire Protection and Safety Engineer, licensed Professional Engineer and a Certified Fire Investigator. He is retired Managing Director of Marsh USA having managed Marsh Risk Consulting's 500 person US consulting business. Jim is a Life Member of NFPA and has served on several standards writing technical committees including the NFPA 1500 Committee for more than ten years.



Joseph Knitter is a 37-plus-year veteran of the fire service, currently serving as Fire Chief for the South Milwaukee (WI) Fire Department, where he has served for the past 34 years. Chief Knitter has an AAS Degree in Fire Science, a BS Degree in Fire Service Management, and is a graduate of the National Fire Academy's Executive Fire Officer Program. In addition, Chief Knitter is a Wisconsin-certified Fire Officer II, Fire Instructor II, and Fire Inspector and is certified by the National Board on Fire Service Professional Qualifications as an Incident Safety Officer. Chief Knitter currently teaches fire certification classes for Milwaukee Area Technical College; incident management for the State of Wisconsin, Division of Emergency Management; and lectures on various topics throughout the area and is also a representative for the Wisconsin Fire Service Training Office and a member of the FireRescue Magazine Advisory Board.



Scott Pahlmann is Chief of the Chapin Volunteer Fire Department in Chapin, Illinois. Chief Pahlmann's career in the fire service started in 1998 with the Illiopolis Fire Protection District serving as Secretary-Treasurer. After a career move, Scott did not return to the fire service until 2006 with the Concord Fire Department, then the Chapin Volunteer Fire Department in August 2007. In December 2011, Chief Pahlmann was ask to be the Interim Chief and later hired as the Fire Chief in early 2012.

The fire service is not the only passion in Chief Pahlmann's life. His background is in Agriculture, with a Bachelor's of Science degree in Agriculture Business from Western Illinois University with a minor in Management and an emphasis in Agronomy. He began working for Dekalb Genetics in Illiopolis before starting with the United States Department of Agriculture's Farm Service Agency as the County Executive Director.

Don't just sit around hoping that the volunteers will knock on your door, those days are over and gone. Spend a few hours with us and leave you with loads of proven techniques and knowledge.


FIRE RESCUE ORGANIZATIONAL GUIDANCE (FROG):
